#### **NEW OFT INSTRUCTORS**

Orange Flight training has two new instructors on board. The school is in the excellent position of having access to four instructors and three aircraft, so can nearly always meet the requirements of students and qualified pilots.

**John McKenzie** (below) isn't really new, as he completed his instructor rating late last year, and has completed about 60 hours of *ab initio* instructing.

The RAAus rules require that instructors



must complete a minimum of 50 hours, and recommend 3 students to the CFI for their first solo, before being elevated to Senior Instructor.

Currently John has one student there two more to go! Our other new man is Angus (Gus) Tobin, pictured below pursuing his other dream of professional cycling. Gus is currently riding with a team in Belgium for the European season.

He completed his Instructor Rating just before leaving for Belgium in March, and also gained his CPL in the same week.

We look forward to having Gus commence instructing when he returns in Spring.

# LATE BREAKING NEWS...

## A FLYING VISIT BY THE MINISTER FOR REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT, SIMON CREAN, BROUGHT GREAT NEWS FOR THE ORANGE REGION

The visit, on short notice, was to announce that Council's application for funding for the expansion of Orange Airport was successful to the tune of \$5 million.

This will complement the contributions by Orange City Council, Cadia Valley Operations and the NSW State Government, providing a total of \$14 million for the proposed works.

The expansion will provide for the extension of the main runway to nearly 2.3 km, increasing the apron area, strengthening and widening the main taxiways and expansion of the terminal building.

It also provides for access roads and provision of services to existing and future hangars.

The runway extension will involve the relocation of some rural roads and property aquisitions, preparatory work for which has been going on for some time as part of the preparation for the submission.





Minister Crean was welcomed by Mayor John Davis, and introduced to Councillors and staff and CVO manager Tony McPaul and staff, and most importantly, to Orange Aero Club Members!

Never one to stand back, OAC President Phil Robertson presented Mr Crean with a club cap as a memento of his visit. The cap was front & centre during the welcome and following announcement, and Mr Crean referred to the "honorary aero club membership" bestowed upon him.

On cue, the Alliance F70 jet chartered to Cadia, landed and taxiied up to the terminal to load mining staff for the trip to Telfer in WA. Mr Crean's visit was part of a round of visits with a similar purpose - announcing Federal community grants to Wagga Wagga, Dubbo and Bathurst as well as Orange. He travelled in style, in the RAAF VIP jet.

Whilst the funding had nothing to do directly with the club's current project, The Max Hazelton Aero Centre, ultimately the club will reap benefits from the development, scheduled to commence late this year.

The event was also important in garnering support for the club's project from Cadia Valley Operations.
